Developmental Disabilities Program

Serving the Bronx, Rockland and Orange County

At Saint Dominic's Family Services, we provide a range of residential and day services for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities—from young adults to seniors. Our programs are designed to foster independence, dignity, and meaningful community involvement.

Individualized Residential Alternatives (IRAs)

Our IRAs offer community based homes for adults with developmental disabilities, supporting personal growth, daily living, and community inclusion. Each residence is tailored to promote independence and a high quality of life.

Day Habilitation

Our Day Habilitation programs provide personalized, goaloriented services in a supportive and engaging environment. Through small-group activities, participants develop life skills, strengthen communication and social connections, explore recreational and wellness opportunities, and engage meaningfully with their community.

Community Habilitation

We offer both Community Habilitation and Community
Habilitation Residential. These services help individuals build
independence through one-on-one support delivered in their homes and the community.
Services are customized to develop real-life skills in areas such as self-care, socialization, and navigating community resources.

2024 IMPACT STATS

154 Individuals living in 24 residences located throughout Rockland, Orange & Bronx Counties.

53,901 Days of care provided to Residents.

55 individuals received services at our Day Habilitation and Community Habilitation Program located throughout Rockland and Orange Counties.

10,405 Days of Day Habilitation Provided.



Success Story Developmental Disabilities Program

Teddy's Story:

Using His Voice to Inspire and Lead


Since beginning his journey at Saint Dominic's Family Services in January 2020, Teddy has thrived both as an artist and advocate. Teddy has nurtured his passion for opera through dedicated vocal lessons, weekly performances, and the unwavering support of the Developmental Disabilities staff and his family.

Teddy shares his voice generously through weekly performances for peers and staff at the Blauvelt Day Habilitation Program. His talents have also reached wider audiences, including a special performance for Archbishop Dolan.

Beyond music, Teddy leads the Campbell Residence band, fostering connection and teamwork through regular rehearsals and performances.

Teddy's journey is a powerful example of how encouragement, stability, and creative opportunities, provided by Saint Dominic's Developmental Disabilities team, can help individuals reach their full potential.





Community Based Services Program

Our Community Based Services program is designed to provide individualized, flexible, and family driven support to children and families navigating emotional, behavioral, and mental health challenges. We deliver services directly in the home or community (schools, libraries, etc.), ensuring accessibility, continuity, and meaningful engagement in the environments where individuals feel most comfortable.

Children and Family Treatment and Support Services (CFTSS) Serving the Bronx & Rockland

CFTSS provides Medicaid covered behavioral health supports for children and youth 21 and under. Services include counseling, family support, and coordination, offered at home or in the community to meet each family's needs.

Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Serving the Bronx and Rockland

HCBS provides Medicaid covered individualized, in-home or community based support for children with complex medical, developmental, or behavioral health needs. Services focus on building independence, stability, and family well-being while reducing the need for higher levels of care in out-of-home placements.

Family Based Therapeutic Intervention (FBTI) Serving the Bronx

FBTI delivers intensive, in-home mental health treatment to strengthen families and address behavioral health challenges. This service is available to Bronx families regardless of Medicaid or insurance status.



2024 IMPACT STATS

497 children received support and counseling to help build individual and family strength, health, and long-term stability.

367 families received services through Child and Family Treatment and Support Services (CFTSS)—programs designed to provide intensive, in-home support to families requiring additional care.

65 families received FBTI services, promoting emotional regulation, coping skills, and resilience.

469 sessions provided where families achieved their treatment goals, showing improvements in communication, parenting, and child mental health outcomes.

266 children from 176 families received HCBS support that enhanced well-being and ensured safe, sustained home living.

Success Story Community Based Services Program

Marcos' Story:

Strengthening Family Bonds
Through Support and Structure

Marcos, diagnosed with ADHD, faced challenges with communication, following directions, and daily routines. His family was referred to Saint Dominic's Family Services Family Based Treatment Program (FBTI) to better understand his needs and learn tools to strengthen their relationships and home environment.

Early sessions revealed struggles with eye contact, expressing emotions, and independence. With guidance from a FBTI family therapist, a structured treatment plan was developed focusing on improving communication, building coping strategies, and fostering a supportive, consistent home environment.

Over time, Marcos began expressing himself more clearly, gained confidence in completing tasks independently, and improved his ability to follow routines. The family as a whole grew stronger, with enhanced communication and mutual understanding.

This progress reflects the power of therapeutic support in helping families navigate mental health challenges and build lasting, healthy connections.

Saint Dominic's FBTI program played a crucial role in this process, offering structured support that equipped Marcos with the essential skills necessary for achieving greater selfsufficiency. This comprehensive approach not only aimed to bolster Marcos' independence but also sought to create a more harmonious and self-

reliant family dynamic overall.





Care Management Program

Saint Dominic's Family Services provides essential support to children and adults with the shared goal of helping families remain together, strong, and supported, while reducing the need for hospitalization or out-of-home care.

Targeted Case Management (TCM)

Serving all NYC Boroughs (Manhattan, Bronx, Queens, Brooklyn, Staten Island) and Lower Hudson Valley (Rockland, Westchester, Putnam, Dutchess, Orange)

TCM helps families navigate complex systems and access vital resources through youth-centered, family-focused support. Our team connects families to community services, educational advocacy, developmental and mental health supports, and child and family advocacy. By addressing challenges and coordinating care, TCM fosters stability, resilience, and collaboration so families feel supported and equipped to thrive.

2024 IMPACT STATS

538 individuals were uniquely supported through connections to community and social services delivered by Saint Dominic's Family Services Care Management Program.

Children's Waiver Program

Serving all NYC Boroughs (Manhattan, Bronx, Queens, Brooklyn, Staten Island) and Lower Hudson Valley (Rockland, Westchester, Putnam, Dutchess, Orange)

Connecting children and youth to more intensive home and community based services that support health, safety, and independence.

Family Support Network Services

Serving Rockland

Empowering caregivers through peer-led support to navigate complex systems and access critical resources for children and young adults with social, emotional, and behavioral needs.





Success Story Care Management Program

Wyatt's Story:

A Path Forward with Care and Commitment

When Wyatt moved to the U.S. in 2020, he faced multiple challenges including behavioral health needs, language barriers, and academic struggles. At just 15, he was navigating a new country while managing symptoms of ADHD, including impulsiveness, inattention, and difficulty following instructions.

Recognizing these needs, Wyatt's mother enrolled him in care management services through Saint Dominic's Family Services. His Care Manager quickly became a consistent, stabilizing figure during a time of great transition. Amid all the changes Wyatt was experiencing, his Care Manager provided steady emotional support and encouraged strong family involvement, helping to create a sense of safety and connection.

The Care Manager also worked closely with Wyatt's mother modeling effective advocacy and empowering her to speak up for her son's needs across school, clinical, and community settings. This collaborative, person-centered approach helped Wyatt gain confidence and allowed the family to feel supported and heard.

With structured in-home support and culturally responsive care, Wyatt began to stabilize emotionally, improve his behavior, and engage more fully at school.

Wyatt's journey is a testament to the power of consistent care, family empowerment, and culturally sensitive support in helping youth overcome barriers and move toward a brighter future.





Enhanced Family Foster Care Program

Serving the Bronx

Saint Dominic's Enhanced Family Foster Care (EFFC) program provides comprehensive support for foster care children with emotional, behavioral, or medical needs by placing them in nurturing family-based homes. Our approach focuses on safety, permanency, and overall well-being, with foster parents receiving specialized training and children benefiting from clinical and case management services.

Key components of the EFFC program include:

Adoption Services: When reunification is not possible, we support legal permanency through adoption, guiding families through the process with legal coordination, training, and postadoption support.

Article 29-I Clinic: On-site medical and behavioral health services ensure foster children's physical and emotional needs are addressed promptly and holistically.

Youth Development: Programs like Preparing Youth for Adulthood (PYA) and Fair Futures provide older youth with life skills training, academic support, and career readiness coaching to prepare them for independence.

Foster Parent Recruitment & Support: Our Homefinding team recruits, certifies, and supports foster parents, with an emphasis on preparing caregivers to meet the complex needs of children through training, development, and ongoing guidance.

Parent Advocacy: Advocates with lived experience in the child welfare system support birth parents through mentoring, court advocacy, and engagement in the reunification process. Through this integrated model, EFFC helps children heal, grow, and move toward

a permanent, loving home.

2024 IMPACT STATS

Enhanced Family Foster Care

Serving **272** children in family foster care.

20 children found forever families through adoption.

44 new foster families opened their hearts and homes to children in need.

Article 29-I Clinic

115 children and youth in foster care received essential medical care including physicals, immunizations, vision, and hearing services, ensuring healthier futures.

312 medication management appointments ensured children received the consistent support they need to thrive.

120 developmental screenings and follow-ups helped identify needs early and connect children to the right supports.



Success Story Enhanced Family Foster Care Program

Mariah's Story:

A Strong Start Through Supportive Foster Care

Mariah entered foster care at just 3 days old in 2017, joining three older siblings already in care. From the beginning, Saint Dominic's Enhanced Family Foster Care staff ensured Mariah was placed in a nurturing, stable environment with her longtime foster parent.

Over the years, monthly home visits confirmed that Mariah was thriving—her needs were met, she was closely bonded with the household, and she was treated as one of the family. She participated in swimming and dance lessons and even traveled with the family to Antigua and England, gaining enriching experiences along the way.

In time, Mariah was adopted by her foster parent, who continues to provide a loving and supportive home. The family remains connected to Saint Dominic's and ensures Mariah maintains strong ties with her biological siblings, who were also adopted by their longtime foster parent.

Mariah's growth and stability reflect the power of dedicated foster care and the commitment of families and staff who believe in every child's potential.



Adult Mental Health Program

Serving Rockland

At Saint Dominic's Family Services, our Adult Mental Health programs provide compassionate, specialized care for adults experiencing mental health challenges.

Supportive Housing

Our Supportive Housing Program helps adults with chronic mental illness live independently in the community. Residents receive affordable, long-term housing with case management and individualized supports to promote stability and well-being.

Community Residential Program

The Community Residential Program offers a supportive, home-like environment for adults with mental health

for adults with mental health challenges, including those with dual diagnoses. With individualized care, life skills training, and community engagement, residents build confidence and prepare to transition to more independent living.

2024 IMPACT STATS

52 individuals were supported through our Supported Housing Program.

42 served by our Community Residences.

592 cumulative months of housing support provided to residents in our Supportive Housing Programs.

390 cumulative months of housing support provided to residents in our Community Residential Program.



Success Stories Adult Mental Health Program

Tiezst's Story:

Finding Stability and Strength Through Supportive Housing

When Tiezst entered Saint Dominic's Family Services' Supportive Housing Program in November 2022, she was facing homelessness and limited support. Though deeply independent, she recognized the need for structured case management and housing to regain stability.

With the support of Saint Dominic's, Tiezst now lives independently in a cozy apartment in the heart of Nyack. She has embraced her community, frequenting local shops, parks, and cultural events, and built strong, meaningful relationships in her neighborhood.

A talented educator, poet, and linguist, Tiezst brings passion and creativity to everything she does. The Supportive Housing Program continues to help her maintain her mental health and well-being, providing the stability she needs to thrive.

Tiezst's journey is one of resilience, and her story reflects the power of compassionate housing support in creating lasting change.



Antonina's Story:

Rebuilding Through Compassionate Care

When Antonina entered Saint Dominic's Family Services' Treatment Apartment Program in June 2022, she was in crisis. She had recently lost her home, suffered a heart attack, and faced the emotional turmoil of her daughter's incarceration and her grandchildren's placement in foster care. The weight of these events left her deeply depressed and emotionally overwhelmed.

At Saint Dominic's, Antonina received consistent, compassionate support. Through regular therapy and staff guidance, she began to rebuild her self-esteem, develop healthy coping strategies, and reduce her reliance on medication. Over time, Antonina regained emotional stability, learned to manage grief, and formed trusting relationships with her care team.

Today, Antonina maintains contact with her daughter, enjoys visits with her grandchildren and son, and continues to reach out for support when needed. Her strength, progress, and resilience are a testament to what's possible with the right support system.

St. Dominic's School

Located in Blauvelt, NY

St. Dominic's School provides a structured, therapeutic educational environment for children and youth from preschool through grade 12. With a focus on individualized support, we help students achieve their full academic, social, and emotional potential. Our programs are supported by a comprehensive range of related services, including counseling, speech and language therapy, occupational therapy, and physical therapy, ensuring each student receives the care and guidance they need to thrive.

Elementary and Middle School (Grades K-8)

Students benefit from a small, structured learning environment focused on intensive academic instruction and social-emotional development. Our approach emphasizes positive behavioral supports and proactive strategies to promote student growth. Students in grades 3-8 participate in either standard New York State Standard Assessments or Alternate Assessment as set forth by their IEP.

High School (Grades 9-12)

Our students engage in a curriculum that balances academic instruction with real-world vocational experiences. The Community-Based Vocational Work Program helps prepare students for the transition from school to adulthood. All high school students participate in New York State Alternate Assessment and exit the program at age 21 with a Skills and Achievement Credential.

Early Childhood Education Program (opened July 2025)

Our therapeutic preschool serves children aged 2.7-5 with special needs in a nurturing, developmentally appropriate environment.

Classrooms maintain an 8:1:2 student-

teacher-assistant ratio and blend early childhood education with therapeutic supports using trauma-informed, attachment-based, and developmentally guided practices to support emotional, social, cognitive, and physical growth.

2024 IMPACT STATS

K-12 Program:

Serves up to **96** students in small, structured classes with an 8:1:1 student-teacherassistant ratio.

Early Childhood Education Program:

Serves up to 16 students in two classes with an 8:1:2 student-teacher-assistant ratio.



Success Story St. Dominic's School

Mouhamed & Lassana's Story:


Learning to Thrive, Not Just Survive

When twin brothers Mouhamed and Lassana entered St. Dominic's School in the 6th grade, they were guarded and carrying the weight of early hardship. But over time, with the support of our Special Education teachers, Physical Therapists, Occupational therapists, Speech Therapists and support staff, their lives began to change.

St. Dominic's became more than a school, it became a safe space where the brothers learned to regulate their emotions, communicate effectively, and build confidence. They participated in job internships, practiced real-world skills, and prepared for independent adulthood through our Life Skills Program.

Today, both work as bus aides, proudly supporting students with special needs. Their next goal: earning their driver's licenses to become full-time bus drivers.

Mouhamed and Lassana often share that St. Dominic's gave them the guidance and support they needed to build a better path for themselves, one filled with purpose, stability, and hope.





TORCH Bronx Preschool and Evaluation Center TO REACH EVERY CHILD (TORCH)

Serving the Bronx

Serving children ages 2.7-5, TORCH Bronx Preschool offers high-quality bilingual and monolingual early childhood education and therapeutic services. Our NYS-approved and NAEYC-accredited program provides individualized support, inclusive practices, and family engagement, along with meals, transportation, and enrichment activities such as science, music, art therapy, Storytime, field trips, and holiday celebrations, preparing children for a successful transition to kindergarten and lifelong learning.

Special Education Classes

We offer full-day special education classes for students with developmental disabilities. Our classrooms are led by highly qualified special education teachers and supported by related service professionals. Providing individualized instruction based on each child's IEP, and specialized services including speech therapy, occupational therapy, and physical therapy. We are proud of our students' progress, with a high percentage transitioning to less restrictive educational settings in kindergarten.

2024 **IMPACT STATS**

95 students served, ages 2.7–5.

75% of staff are Bilingual Spanish speakers.

Approximately 100 evaluations were completed, including psychological, social history, speech, and educational evaluations, with some also including occupational and/or physical therapy evaluations in the 2024-2025 school year.

Integrated Class

Our Integrated Class, also known as a Special Class in an Integrated Setting (SCIS) brings together students with and without IEPs in inclusive classrooms co-taught by general and special education staff. This collaborative approach fosters peer learning, social-emotional development, and individualized support within a developmentally appropriate curriculum that balances play-based exploration with structured instruction.

Evaluation Center

The TORCH Evaluation Center offers comprehensive evaluations for preschool-aged children suspected of developmental delays, conducted by experienced psychologists,

educators, and therapists.

These evaluations provide a pathway for families to access appropriate preschool special education services.



Success Stories TORCH Bronx Preschool

Roniel's Story:

Finding His Voice and Gaining Independence

When Roniel first enrolled in Saint Dominic's TORCH program, he communicated using only one or two words and gestures. Frustrated by his limited ability to express himself, he was referred for speech and occupational therapy.

He also tended to play in isolation and struggled significantly with sharing and taking turns. Through the consistent support of Saint Dominic's speech therapists, who used strategies such as modeling and structured group tasks, Roniel began to interact more with his peers and develop stronger social communication skills.

Now in his second year, Roniel speaks in full sentences, expresses his feelings, and confidently answers questions. His language development has improved his ability to manage transitions, form friendships, and engage more fully in the classroom. He can fluently read at a pre-K level and beyond, an achievement that reflects his determination and the dedication of his TORCH teachers and therapists.

Roniel has also made major gains in fine motor skills, daily living tasks, and social-emotional development. Once shy and self-directed, he is now empathetic, helpful to classmates, and able to follow routines with growing independence. He is eager to participate in activities, and proud of his accomplishments.

Roniel's growth shows the transformative power of early intervention, consistent care, and the nurturing support of the TORCH team.








2024 Friends of Saint Dominic's Sporting Clays Tournament
